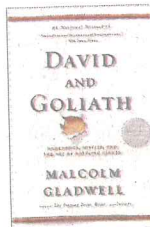

THE DISCOVERY

A filtration plant in a Toronto park doubles as a shimmering art work of falling water. A hospital in Singapore built in the middle of a lush garden functions as a community center as well as a place of healing. These are among the model developments described in "**Designed for the Future: 80 Practical Ideas for a Sustainable World**" (Princeton Architectural) by Jared Green. A page of text and a full-page photo are devoted to each of the ideas, which range from banning cars near the Colosseum in Rome to opening a children's library in a subway station in Medellín, Colombia.
